WARREN COUNTY APPROVED FOR \$50K PLANNING GRANT

Warren County Community Foundation has received a \$50,000 planning grant as part of the eighth phase of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s initiative, Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow (GIFT VIII). With the grant, the Community Foundation will bring Ball State Indiana Community Institute to Warren County for two workshops. We will be able to invite 30 stakeholders to each. One will be placemaking and the other will be marketing and storytelling. The Foundation director will also attend two placemaking conferences. We will engage a consulting firm to help create a Warren County Trails Master Plan, and gain access to a data analysis and research tool that will help guide our decision making on future projects and grant requests.

REGIONAL PLANNING GRANT OF \$50K APPROVED BY LILLY ENDOWMENT FIGT VIII

Warren County Community Foundation and Western Indiana Community Foundation have received a \$50,000 regional planning grant as part of the eighth phase of Lilly Endowment Inc.'s initiative, Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow (GIFT VIII). With the grant, the community foundation will engage a consulting firm to help create the Wabash River Blueway Plan. Warren, Fountain, and Vermillion counties have over 60 miles of the Wabash River forming their borders. The river has untapped potential for recreation, historic and scientific education, the arts, and attracting visitors. The next four months will be spent looking at some of the possibilities. 






WARREN COUNTY-OPOLY: A GREAT CHRISTMAS GIFT
