YOUNG EXPLORERS RECEIVES A COMMUNITY GRANT!

The Young Explorers received a grant of \$2,470 from the Warren County Community Foundation.

The grant provided will assist the Young Explorers Program by providing supplies for students in all three elementary schools. Lessons that will benefit from this grant are lessons in dissection, hydroponics (a method of growing plants without soil, using mineral nutrient solutions in a water-based solution), electric motor kits for circuitry, and more! This fund gives an opportunity to expand and continue enriching and challenging lessons!

Shannon Crumbaugh is the teacher for this program. She accepted the check and is excited to get supplies ordered in time for the new school year.










The Warren County Impact Fund is offering a 1:1 match towards the creation of a new fund at the Foundation. The donor is willing to match \$10,000!!!

The Warren County Impact Fund is the newest fund at the Warren County Community Foundation. A coalition group has been formed and has had two meetings to talk about health and wellness in Warren County. You are going to hear about many things that this fund is accomplishing in Warren County. We have been working with Ascension St. Vincent, the Warren County Health Department and other community partners to come up with goals of what we would like to accomplish both short-term and long-term. A Better Way Food Co-Op is one organization in Warren County doing great work. This organization relies on private donations from local individuals, organizations, and churches. MURAL CELEBRATION AND ABE LINCOLN VISIT FOR AMERICA 250!

On Wednesday July 2nd, we celebrated the completion of a mural commemorating Abe Lincoln's visit to State Line City on February 11th, 1861. He was on his journey from Springfield, Illinois to Washington DC for his inauguration. There is a memorial plaques at the corner of the park in State Line City that was dedicated in 1930. Now when you visit State Line, you can see that stone and plaque. Then you can walk across the street and see the mural painted by Zac Cody, local artist. The project was joint funded by the Community Foundation and State Line City. The timing is great with our celebration of America's 250th anniversary kicking off last month. Indiana has decided to celebration America's 250th anniversary from June 14th, 2025 through July 4th, 2026. We hope to do something each month to celebrate this milestone. Adding icing on the cake of a great ribbon cutting with the Town Council and Zac was an Abe Lincoln impersonator. First, Zac talked about his process for painting this large mural which required four levels of scaffolding. He asnswered questions about the challenges he faced with getting everything to scale, and how much the old bricks soaked in the paint. After Zac finished answering questions, we indroduced the 16th President to the group. Abe talked for about 20 minutes about his childhood, his family, some of the hardships he faced, and ended with talking about slavery and delivered his Gettysburg Address speech to us. It was a fun evening! Zac just started a new mural for us as well. He just started on July 3rd at Potawatomi Springs in Independence and will be working on that project over the next couple of weeks if you want to go there and watch him paint.



NEW STORY AT THE STORYBOOK TRAIL!

Just in time for the holiday weekend, a new story has been placed at the Storybook Trail at the Williamsport Falls Trails. This trail is part of the Too Small to Fail Grant that Warren County received from the Clinton Foundation This story is "Jack and the Cornstalk" Tis the season for corn and beans in Warren County.
